¹ **Parliamentary Elections Act, Section 105.**—(1) Before 12.30p.m. on the day of nomination, any candidate may, by writing under his hand, indicate to the Returning Officer which of his names mentioned in the nomination paper he desires should be omitted and which should be specified by initial only.

(2) For the purposes of the election, the names which the candidate desires to omit may be omitted and an initial may be used in place of those names which he desires should be specified by initial.
