

2. COMPARABILITY OF OFFICE

Describe the nature of the office stated in Section 1, your performance in that office, and explain why your service in that position has given you experience and ability that is comparable to the experience and ability of a person who satisfies Article 19(3)(a) or (b).

I submit that I meet the requirements under clauses 19(2) and 19(3)(c) of the Constitution. I served in GIC Private Limited ("GIC") from 1 July 1986 to 1 February 2015, and was GIC's Group Chief Investment Officer ("GCIO") from 16 July 2007 until 1 February 2013¹. GIC is a company listed under Part 2 of the Fifth Schedule of Singapore's Constitution. The period of my service as GCIO exceeded 3 years and falls wholly within 20 years of a writ of election called in 2023.

In an investment company, the GCIO is as significant as a chief executive officer ("CEO").

GIC did not have a CEO position until 2017². During my time as GCIO, there was a Group Managing Director (later re-designated Group President) whom I reported administratively to. Notably, GIC's first CEO appointed in 2017 is Mr Lim Chow Kiat – who succeeded me as GIC's GCIO when I retired in 2013³.

As GIC's GCIO, I was responsible and accountable for GIC's investment performance. I led GIC to deliver the investment returns which was GIC's mission for Singapore. I made key investment decisions, developed and implemented group strategies for GIC and steered GIC through various financial crises. I retired as GCIO in Feb 2013 after spending 27 years in GIC. For year ended 31 Mar 2013, GIC's annualised 20-year real rate of return was 4.0%. In USD nominal terms, GIC achieved an annualised return of 6.5% over the 20-year time period⁴. This was achieved under my stewardship.

I also served on GIC's Board of Directors chaired by Mr Lee Kuan Yew from 1 December 1999 to 1 February 2013. I was accountable to the Board for GIC's investment performance

and represented management in responding to questions fielded by the Board members. CEOs similarly serve on and are accountable to their corporate boards.

As GCIO, I was a member of GIC's Group Executive Committee ("GEC") - the highest management body in GIC chaired by then GIC's deputy Chairman and executive director Dr Tony Tan. Apart from investment and risk policy issues, the GEC also reviewed and approved major personnel, business and operational policies that apply to the entire GIC During these years, I had the privilege to help identify and nurture talent within the GIC for leadership continuity. Many of the top management in GIC today were those that I mentored directly or indirectly, and others are also contributing back to Singapore in the financial industry and the wider community.

I also played a key role in developing GIC into a widely respected sovereign wealth fund, known for prudence, competence and integrity. From 1986 to the time I left, GIC grew from 3 to 9 offices and from a staff strength of 54 to over 1000 with different nationalities and diverse backgrounds. GIC also developed into a world-class organisation during this time. This was important for the vision for Singapore to develop the personnel capability of managing Singapore's reserves ourselves⁵.

In recognition of my service to Singapore, I was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal in 2012⁶.

My contributions to GIC during my tenure have also been recognised by the Prime Minister (as Chairman of GIC) in his valedictory letter dated 3 January 2013 to me⁷.

I strongly believe that my experience and ability amassed over my time in GIC is comparable to the experience and ability of a person who satisfies Article 19(3)(b) of the Constitution of Singapore.

3. EXPERIENCE AND ABIITY

State why you have the experience and ability to effectively carry out the functions and duties of the office of President.

Under the Constitution, the President is the Head of State and is vested with a number of custodial powers – including to safeguard Singapore's reserves.

I devoted more than 42 years of my career initially playing a part in its establishment, and thereafter to grow and preserve Singapore's reserves. For my services in reserves management, I was awarded the Public Administration Medal (Gold) (1996) and the Meritorious Services Medal 2012². Significantly, the Meritorious Service Medal is awarded to a "person who has performed within Singapore, service of conspicuous merit characterized by resource and devotion to duty, including long service marked by exceptional ability merit and exemplary conduct"³.

I deeply understand the importance of Singapore's national reserves and its role as a buffer for Singapore in times of crisis, and that it is a key pillar in enhancing the stability of the Singapore social fabric and economy. Singapore is highly exposed to the unpredictability of the global economy. I know first-hand that amassing Singapore' reserves to what it is today was not an easy task and I am acutely aware that the reserves should be used judiciously. I strongly believe I am well placed to safeguard Singapore reserves for the present, and for future generations.

Currently, I am the executive Chairman of Avanda Investment Management Pte Ltd ("Avanda") – a Singapore company which I founded in 2015 to offer investment services to public agencies, endowments and foundations, and family offices in Singapore and abroad. In addition to governance oversight and board leadership, I am closely involved in developing Avanda's business and investment strategies, reviewing its financials and progress, and driving growth.

The President also exercises powers to veto appointments of key public officers and serves a protective function in the investigation, detention or restraint of person(s) under certain Acts. My career began in 1970 and over the years, I have had the opportunity to meet, interact and work with a spectrum of people in the public and private sectors, both locally and internationally, in good times and bad and over extended periods of time. From all this experience, I believe that I am a good judge of character and people. I can and will make difficult decisions (within the parameters of the President's powers) if needed to uphold the integrity of the system and values it is designed to protect.

The President is also head of the State – representing Singapore on the international stage. I am privileged to have had the opportunity to interact and collaborate with senior people in the international financial industry.

I sat on the Global Advisory Board of Pacific Investment Management Company LLC ("PIMCO GAB") alongside *inter alia* Ben Bernanke, Gordon Brown and Mark Carney from 2015⁴. I stepped down from the PIMCO GAB when I announced my wish to run for the office of the elected President.

I was awarded the Thomas L Hansberger Leadership in Global Investment Award by the CFA Institute in 2013 for my contribution to the investment industry in integrating investment organizations and capital markets worldwide⁵.

In the early 1980s, I served as founding Chairman of the Singapore International Monetary Exchange ("SIMEX"). SIMEX collaborated with the Chicago Mercantile Exchange to launch the Mutual Offset System which was one of the earliest exchange linkages in the history of the derivatives industry⁶. In recognition of my work in the international futures industry, I was inducted into the Futures Hall of Fame by the Futures Industry Association in 2009⁷.
