


Submit the names of polling agents appointed at respective special polling stations (if any)

 **By 04 Jul**, no later than two clear days before Polling Day


 Submit in person

 For special voting arrangements at nursing homes, the number of polling agents that may be admitted to each special polling station to observe polling proceedings is one polling agent per candidate per polling place and one polling agent per candidate per mobile polling team. The role of a polling agent is to observe that polling at the special polling station is carried out in accordance with the law. He must also maintain secrecy of voting at all times.

You or any of your election agents must submit the full names (as shown in NRIC) and NRIC numbers of all the polling agents appointed at each special polling station (if any) to the Returning Officer no later than two clear days before the start of polls at special polling stations. This includes polling agents who may be changed or substituted during the course of Polling Day.

When entering a special polling station for the first time, the polling agent must submit a duly completed *Oath of Secrecy* form (original signed and attested copy) to the election officials at that special polling station.

Polling agents appointed at special polling stations may board the vehicle transporting the sealed ballot boxes from a special polling station to the counting centre. The polling agent must submit the duly completed and signed Indemnity Form for Participation in Observing the Transportation of Sealed Ballot Boxes to the election officials at that special polling station before 6pm on Polling Day. Only one polling agent per candidate (or the candidate himself) may board the vehicle. If there is already one polling agent representing the candidate on the vehicle, any other polling agent representing the same candidate will not be allowed to board.
