- In an open election, each candidate has to produce for nomination (i) the **Community Certificate** issued by the Community Committee; or in lieu of the Community Certificate; (ii) the **Notice of Rejection of Application for Community Certificate**; or (iii) the **Notice of Acceptance of Community Declaration** & the **Statutory Declaration that Nominee Does Not Belong to Any Community**.
- In a reserved election, each candidate has to produce for nomination the **Community Certificate for the community to which the election is reserved**.

Persons who wish to contest in the Presidential election **must submit certificate applications to both the Presidential Elections Committee (PEC) and the Community Committee**. 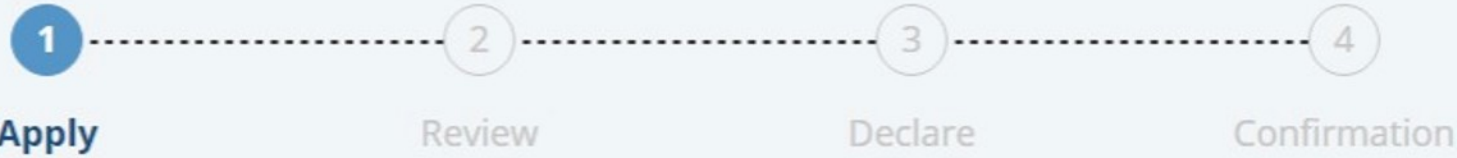
