In exercise of the powers conferred by section 8A(1)(a) of the Parliamentary Elections Act, the President hereby makes the following Order:

**Citation and commencement**

**1.** This Order may be cited as the Parliamentary Elections (Declaration of Group Representation Constituencies) Order 2011 and shall come into operation on 24th February 2011.

**Group representation constituencies**

**2.** The electoral divisions specified in the Schedule are declared to be group representation constituencies.

**Number of candidates**

**3.** Any election in the group representation constituencies specified —

- (a) in Part I of the Schedule shall be held on the basis of a group of 4 candidates;

- (b) in Part II of the Schedule shall be held on the basis of a group of 5 candidates; and
- (c) in Part III of the Schedule shall be held on the basis of a group of 6 candidates.

### **Revocation**

4. The Parliamentary Elections (Declaration of Group Representation Constituencies) Order 2006 (G.N. No. S 146/2006) is revoked.
