# COMPETENT AUTHORITIES FOR COUNTERMEASURES ON POLITICALLY SIGNIFICANT PERSONS, ETC.

It is notified for general information that the Minister for Home Affairs has, under section 105(1)(b) of the Foreign Interference (Countermeasures) Act 2021, appointed the public sector officers set out in the first column of the Schedule to be competent authorities responsible for the administration of the Parts or provisions of the Act set out opposite in the second column of the Schedule, with effect from 29 December 2023:
