CANDIDATE ADVISORY FOR GENERAL ELECTION 2020

This advisory to candidates highlights the key changes to election processes for General Election (GE) 2020. Details can be found in the Candidate Handbook for General Election 2020. The Elections Department (ELD) has also updated the Guide for Polling Agents and the Guide for Counting Agents for General Election 2020. These publications are available on the ELD website.

Key dates

2. For GE 2020, Nomination Day is 30 Jun 2020 (Tue) and Polling Day is 10 Jul 2020 (Fri).

Nomination

3. The Nomination Places are listed at <u>Annex A</u>. Persons seeking candidature (candidates), their subscribers i.e. a proposer, a seconder and assentors for each candidate (or group of candidates) and one other person appointed by each candidate may enter the Nomination Centres from 10 am on Nomination Day.

4. Only candidates¹ who meet the following conditions may be allowed to enter the Nomination Place from 10.30 am on Nomination Day:

- The candidate has been issued a Political Donation Certificate²;
- The candidate is accompanied by a proposer, a seconder and at least four assentors³; and
- In the case of Group Representation Constituency (GRC)⁴ candidates, the relevant candidate in the group has been issued the relevant certificate⁵ from either the Malay Community Committee or the Indian and Other Minority Communities Committee.

5. Nomination proceedings will begin at <u>11 am sharp</u>. The time for accepting nominations will end at <u>12 noon sharp</u>. Objections can be made to nominations filed from 11 am. From 12 noon until 12.30 pm, only objections can be made but no nominations can be filed.

¹ An aspiring candidate who is unwell and certified by a medical practitioner to be unfit to attend Nomination proceedings in person, can authorise a representative to file his Nomination papers. The Authorised Representative must have the Power of Attorney, which must include authorisation to submit the Nomination papers and to raise objections to the Nomination papers of other candidates.

² Candidates can apply for the Political Donation Certificate online via Candidate Services or in person at ELD Prinsep Link not later than 26 Jun 2020 (Fri).

³ Subscribers (i.e. seconder, proposer, assentors) who are unwell will not be allowed to enter the Nomination Centre. Candidates should replace subscribers who are unwell.

⁴ In the case of a GRC, the following additional requirements also have to be met: the number of members of the group must satisfy the number of candidates designated for the GRC; all the members in the group must belong to the same political party, or must be seeking to stand as a group of independent candidates; and all the members in the group must be present.

⁵ Candidates can apply for the relevant minority community certificate online via Candidate Services or in person at ELD not later than 26 Jun 2020 (Fri).

Updates to election processes

6. Candidates should note the following updates to election processes, and refer to the relevant paragraphs in the Candidate Handbook for details.

- a) Enhancements to digital services for candidates (section 2.1 in <u>Handbook</u>). In light of the COVID-19 situation, candidates are encouraged to use the expanded digital services for candidates (i.e. Candidate Services) on the ELD website to prepare their submissions. All forms for nomination can be printed from the ELD website to be filled out in hard copy, so there is no need to come to ELD to collect hard copy forms. The list of digital services for candidates is at <u>Annex B</u>;
- b) Provision for applicants for minority community certificates to submit additional information to support their application (section 1.3 in Handbook). The additional information must be set out in a statutory declaration and not exceed two pages. The original copy of the statutory declaration must be submitted in person or by post to ELD not later than 26 Jun 2020 (Fri);
- <u>Entry into the Nomination Place (section 3.2.1 in Handbook)</u>. Only candidates who meet the conditions listed in para 4 above may be allowed to enter the Nomination Place on Nomination Day;
- d) <u>Election deposit is \$13,500 per candidate (section 2.2 in Handbook)</u>. We encourage candidates to pay via electronic funds transfer through Candidate Services. Candidates may also pay using bank draft or certified cheque (made payable to "Elections Department") at ELD office at Prinsep Link;
- e) Update to rules governing display of posters and banners (section <u>4.5.3 in Handbook</u>). The size of printed election advertising will be streamlined to two maximum sizes, with an increase in the maximum size for small printed election advertising in Single Member Constituencies. Candidates will also be allowed to display 25% more large printed election advertising (i.e. maximum size of 9m by 1.2m);
- f) <u>Revised campaigning guidelines under COVID-19 (section 4.6 and 4.7 in Handbook)</u>. As large group gatherings are not allowed under the prevailing MOH guidelines, no Police permits will be granted for physical rallies and gatherings at Assembly Centres on Counting Night. In lieu of physical rallies, there will be more airtime on national free-to-air TV channels for political parties and candidates and Government will provide venues that candidates can apply and use for holding e-rally livestreams (see also paras 7 and 8 Party and Constituency Political Broadcasts below);
- g) <u>Declaration of use of paid Internet election advertising (IEA) and stating on paid IEA that it was paid for by them, their political party or an authorised third party campaigner (section 4.5.1.2 in Handbook)</u>. This is to enhance accountability and better safeguard the integrity of the election process. There is no change to the timing that the declaration must be made; and

h) <u>Streamlining of forms and process for returns respecting election</u> <u>expenses and requirement to state in the form the candidates'</u> <u>expenses on paid IEA (section 10.7 in Handbook)</u>. Candidates are to use the revised Form 19 to submit their election expenses returns to the Returning Officer. They will also have to clearly state their expenses on paid IEA in the returns.

Party and Constituency Political Broadcasts

7. There will be television airtime for candidates to reach out to voters at the national level, through the Party and the Constituency Political Broadcasts. There will be two Party Political Broadcasts (PPBs) aired across 19 TV and radio channels on 2 July 2020 and 9 July 2020. Only political parties that field at least six candidates under a recognised party symbol are eligible for PPBs, and eligible political parties will be informed of their allocated time on Nomination Day. The Infocomm Media Development Authority (IMDA) will be issuing guidelines on the conduct of the PPBs by 25 June 2020.

8. For the Constituency Political Broadcasts (CPBs), each candidate contesting in a Single Member Constituency (SMC) will be given 3 minutes of airtime, while each group of candidates contesting in a Group Representation Constituency (GRC) will be given 12 minutes or 15 minutes respectively, depending on whether it is a 4- or 5-member GRC. The CPBs will be aired on Channel 5, starting from 3 July 2020. Similarly, IMDA will be issuing guidelines on the conduct of the CPBs by 25 June 2020.

Provision of venues to facilitate e-rallies

9. Candidates can apply to use venues (up to 10 venues a day) provided by the Government for live streaming during the following hours from 1 July to 8 July 2020:

- a. <u>7 am to 10 am</u>
- b. <u>12 noon to 3 pm</u>
- c. <u>7 pm to 10 pm</u>

10. Candidates may submit one application for each timeslot in a day from 30 June 2020 via Candidate Services on ELD Website. Each timeslot will cost \$107. Candidates will only be provided power, internet connectivity and basic furnishings in the venues. Candidates must make their own arrangements for live streaming at the site and ensure successful delivery of their own livestreams. Terms and conditions for the use of the venues will be made available for reference before the application window.

11. Political parties and candidates are reminded that the publication of all their livestreams, whether from inside or outside the provided venues and timeslots, must comply with prevailing laws. Platforms used for live streaming must be declared to the Returning Officer. Foreigners are prohibited from taking part in any election activity or publishing election advertising, including livestreams.

Safety measures at election proceedings

12. ELD will put in place safety measures for nomination, polling and counting proceedings (see para 3.1.1, 6.1.1 and 7.1 of Handbook). These measures will protect the health and safety of voters, candidates and election officials.

13. Temperature screening will be conducted at election premises. Candidates and their election agents with fever or respiratory symptoms will not be allowed to enter election premises. The only exception is that candidates detected to have fever or respiratory symptoms during the temperature screening will be allowed into the Nomination Centre to file their papers. However, if a candidate has already appointed an Authorised Representative, he can send his representative, and should not show up at the Nomination Centre. ELD calls on everyone to be socially responsible, and to play their part by adhering to safe distancing and safe management measures to ensure a safe election amid the COVID-19 situation.

Other advisories

14. Candidates should also read the following advisories/guidelines to political parties and candidates which are available on the ELD website:

- (a) Advisory on threat of foreign interference in elections and precautionary measures;
- (b) Advisory on cybersecurity risks and precautionary measures;
- (c) Advisory on application of Personal Data Protection Act to election activities;
- (d) Advisory on online campaigning and cybersecurity protocols; and
- (e) Advisory on safe physical campaigning during the GE 2020

15. ELD has also prepared a candidate's checklist for the different stages of the election at <u>Annex C</u>. This list is not exhaustive. Candidates are advised to refer to the legislation and the Candidate Handbook for more details.

Prepare Nomination Paper

Up to 4 versions of the Nomination Paper can be drafted and saved. Nomination Papers do not have to be completely filled up. System auto-checks for whether the names of the proposer, seconder and assentors are in the relevant Register of Electors when the electoral division is specified.

Prepare form to appoint one other person

Lodge all printed election advertising with ELD before you display them
Submit list of persons authorised to conduct election activity
 Submit address of election office (if needed)
Download 50m prohibition zone map from Candidate Services so that you do not display posters and banners within 50m of any polling station
□ Apply for Perambulating Vehicle permit from Police (if needed)
□ Apply for e-rally livestreaming venues (if needed)
□ Adhere to safe distancing guidelines at all times when carrying out walkabouts etc. (e.g. avoid physical contact with members of the public)
□ Refer to the Gazettes for the list of polling stations in the electoral division that you are contesting in, and counting centres. You can download the bus sequence for ballot box delivery from polling stations to counting centres from Candidate Services to plan for your polling agent to witness the process to transport the ballot boxes from polling stations to counting centres.
