PRESS RELEASE

REVISION OF THE REGISTERS OF ELECTORS

In accordance with section 14(1)¹ of the Parliamentary Elections Act, the Prime Minister has directed the Registration Officer to revise the registers of electors and to complete the revision on or before 30 Apr 2015. The revision is to bring the registers up to date.

- In order to qualify as an elector, a person has to be a Singapore Citizen and 21 years old and above as of 1 Feb 2015, and not disqualified as an elector under any written law. In addition, the person must have a Singapore residential address² registered with the Immigration & Checkpoints Authority as of 1 Feb 2015 so that his/her name can be entered or retained in the register for a constituency.
- 3 Elections Department will be providing more details on how Singaporeans can check the registers in the later part of February.

¹ Section 14(1) of the Parliamentary Elections Act (PEA) provides that the Minister may from time to time, but in any case not later than 3 years after the last general election, require the Registration Officer to revise the registers of electors and complete the revision before such date as the Minister may, by notification in the *Gazette*, appoint.

² This can be the person's NRIC address, or if the person is residing overseas, a contact address in Singapore that the person has registered with ICA under section 8(2) of the National Registration Act.
