Written Reply to Parliamentary Question on Whether The Electoral Boundaries Review Committee (EBRC) Has Allowed The Size of Each Constituency to Deviate by up to 30%

Question:

Ms Hazel Poa: To ask the Prime Minister (a) whether the Electoral Boundaries Review Committee (EBRC) has allowed the size of each constituency to deviate by up to 30%, instead of 20% previously, from the mean size of constituencies since 1980 and, if so, why; (b) whether the terms of reference to the EBRC should include an instruction to 'ensure more equal representation'; and (c) if not, will such an instruction be reinserted into the terms of reference for subsequent EBRCs.

Written Reply by Mr Chan Chun Sing, Minister of Education, for the Prime Minister:

- Since 1980, the Electoral Boundaries Review Committee (EBRC) has adopted a planning norm of \pm 30% variation in the average number of electors per Member of Parliament (MP) in its review of electoral boundaries.
- This approach balances the considerations for fair representation, with the need for more adjustments to the electoral boundaries arising from population shifts.
