EXHIBITION OF THE REGISTERS OF ELECTORS & REGISTRATION OF OVERSEAS ELECTORS

The exhibition of the revised Registers of Electors for the 23 Constituencies (14 Group Representation Constituencies and 9 Single Member Constituencies) has closed on 8 March 2010. The Registers of Electors will be certified when all the claims and objections are processed.

2 The registration of overseas electors will remain open. Application for registration may be done online via the Elections Department website (<http://www.elections.gov.sg>), or submitted by hand or post to the Elections Department or to any of the 9 designated Singapore diplomatic missions listed in Annex A, using the “Application to be Overseas Elector” form downloaded from the Elections Department website.
